Finding Safety and Support: Steps to Take If You're Experiencing Abuse



What is Domestic Violence and Abuse?

Domestic (or family) violence and abuse is a pattern of behavior used by an individual to gain and maintain power and control over an intimate partner or family member(s). This behavior can take many forms and typically falls into one or more of the following categories:

- **Physical Abuse:** Acts of physical violence against the victim or even family pets.
- **Sexual Abuse:** Any sexual activity forced upon the victim without their willing consent.
- **Emotional Abuse:** Includes insults, threats, manipulation, gaslighting, isolation, and other tactics meant to degrade or control.
- **Economic Abuse:** Restricting access to financial resources, creating financial resources, creating financial dependency, or stealing money or assets.

Signs and Symptoms of Abuse

Some signs of abuse are visible, such as bruises, cuts, or broken bones. Others may be more subtle, including:

- Emotional distress or agitation
- Withdrawal from family and friends
- Loss of interest in daily activities
- Financial hardship
- Suicidal thoughts or behaviors
- Isolation from loved ones
- Denial of basic needs, like food, sleep, or medical care
- Forced sexual activity
- Being locked in or out of the home

Warning Signs of a Potential Abuser

While abusive individuals may hide their behavior, some red flags include:

- Extreme jealousy or possessiveness
- Controlling behavior
- Rapid involvement in relationships
- Unrealistic expectations

- Isolation tactics
- Blaming others for personal issues
- Hypersensitivity to perceived sights

What to Do If You're Being Abused

First and foremost, know that you are not to blame and you deserve safety and respect. If you're in immediate danger, call 911.

If you're unsure about your next steps, consider contacting the National Domestic Violence Hotline at 1-800-799-SAFE (1-800-799-7233). They offer confidential support and guidance,

Safety Planning Tips:

- Hide a spare set of car keys.
- Pack a bag with essentials (clothes, documents, money, medications) and store it in a safe place, such as a friend's house.
- Create a plan for contacting police in an emergency consider using a code word and trusted individuals.

Supporting Someone Experiencing Abuse

Helping someone in a domestic violence situation requires sensitivity and readiness. Before offering help, ensure the person is open to receiving it. If you commit to helping, be prepared to follow through.

Ways to Support:

- Call 911 if the person is in immediate danger.
- Listen without judgement.
- Connect them with a domestic violence advocate for support and resources.
- Help them develop and execute a safety plan when they're ready.

King David said, "I would have given up unless I believed to see the goodness of the Lord in the land of the living." David expresses his assurance that he will witness God's goodness and blessings during his lifetime. Even amid difficulties and dangers, he "believed to see" God do what He had always done... come through!

What does it mean to believe... hope... and expect? It is an optimistic anticipation of something to come.

H.O.P.E. - "Having Optimism, Perseverance, and Expectancy"... to witness God's promises. The abbreviation simulates King David's expression. It goes beyond wishing things will work out. It is a deep knowing that God's goodness will be seen even in the darkest times. HOPE perseveres through hardships, trusting they will work together for good for those who love God and are called according to His purpose.

Believing is the precursor for hope to exist. Trusting anything we don't believe in is impossible. Jesus said miracles were few in his hometown because of the people's unbelief. So ask yourself, "Am I a believer of who God says He is... and promises attached to His existence?" The answer to this question is crucial because what we believe fuels our hope and expectancy.

Our expectations, which are firmly rooted in our commitment to align our lives with the Word of God and His plans, serve as the driving force behind our actions. With this alignment comes a confident faith that enables us to face any obstacle that may come our way.

So, what does it look like to align our lives with God's Word? God's alignment starts with reading, reflecting, and applying Bible teachings to our daily activities. Meditating on His Word and cultivating a spirit of gratefulness through our actions. Being mindful of negative thought patterns and rejecting those not associated with the message of the cross. Finally, waiting eagerly to experience all that He promised.

Remember, our beliefs fuel our hope, igniting our expectations to see the manifestation of God's promises; they will not return to Him void.
